Seem also likely that if another contractor gets the contract, which is an eventuality, it won't happen before Spring next year. It means, that by the end of all this, ABC, the company that came in last in two sequential RFPs last will have gotten a 3 yr contract equivalent

CM Ken Houston is trying to get his EMP revision to go directly to Council, on urgency. He's claiming that it's urgent, given SF's new law about RV parking and he also wants it to go to Public Safety instead of Life Enrichment.

Fife noted that even with urgency the City doesn't have capacity to move a new plan urgently, but says she's open to urgent scheduling to any committee.

Per Jenkins, and City staff, KTOP and City Clerk's will both be upgrading their technology in the break, and scheduling a meeting in August may be difficult for those reasons.

This is the second Rules meeting in as many weeks that Houston has joined, and caused to become a special meeting of full council, then used as a platform for his own political views, not scheduling.

Despite claims by many CMS, there have been more encampment evictions this year than at any other time in the past five years. The urgency claim belies significant city evictions throughout east and west Oakland in the past two months. Strange ignorance of it.

Jenkins says they will work on scheduling a special public safety committee meeting on 9/10; with expectation of forwarding it to 9/16 meeting.

There is not confirmation that there would be quorum for that meeting, but probable.

That's it for the meeting. In Open Forum Isaac Kos-Read lobbyist for Marina Security and Becker Boards, he says there's a possible compromise, but didn't comment specifics.
